ITINERARY

Day 1 October 11, Monday: Depart USA

This afternoon, depart Cleveland-Hopkins and Newark Liberty International Airports via Continental Airlines for your overnight transatlantic flight to Berlin.

Dinner, breakfast and beverages will be served aloft. (D,B)

Day 2 October 12, Tuesday: Arrive Berlin

Upon arrival at Berlin-Tegel International Airport, go through Passport Control, claim your luggage and a Passages by Peter's Way tour manager will meet you upon your exit from Customs and the baggage area. Board your comfortable motor coach and soon you will be on your way to for your orientation ride as we motor down the world famous Unter Der Linden and the Street of Processions, Ishtar Gate, the Market Gate of Millet, to the Royal Tomb of Assurnasirpal II, the Soviet Memorial, Treptow and drive along Karl-Allee to the Alexanderplatz. Check into hotel. Evening Prayer in common.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Berlin. (D)

Day 3 October 13, Wednesday: Highlight tour of Berlin - Wittenburg - Eisleben

After breakfast, begin our city tour where history and recent events are brought to life during our sightseeing. Drive by way of the Kaiser-Wilhelm Church to the Postdamer Platz, Philharmonic Hall, the famous Brandenburg Gate, the Reichstag, Congress Hall, and Bellevue Castle. Stop to admire the Column of Victory and then, continue by way of the Ernst-Reutter Platz to the Opera and Charlottenburg Castle, United States Army Headquarters, the "Free" University, Botanical Gardens and Schoenberg Town Hall. Independent lunch. Early afternoon, leave Berlin and drive to Wittenberg, where Luther lived and worked from 1508 to 1546. Walk through the old part of town to see Luther's House, a former Augustinian Monastery; the Parish Church, with an Altar painting by Lucas Cranach the Elder depicting Luther while preaching and Melancthon baptizing a child; and Castle Church where Luther nailed his 95 theses to the door and where Reformers are buried. Then, we continue to Eisleben to check-in at hotel. Evening Prayer in common.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Eisleben. (B,D)

Day 4 October 14, Thursday: Eisleben - Erfurt - Eisenach/Wartburg

After breakfast, we tour Eisleben, where Luther was born in 1483 and died in 1546. During a walk through Lutherstadt Eisleben, we will become familiar with the birthplace of Martin Luther, today housing Bibles, pamphlets, coins and medals from the time of the Reformation. We will also see the Death House and Chamber of Luther where his original letters and portraits are found. Then, we continue to Erfurt, our tour will highlight the sights of the "City of Flower Cultivation" and a city closely associated with Martin Luther. We will see the Erfurt Cathedral and the Seven Church - both containing valuable treasures of art. The St. Augustine's Monastery with the Luther Memorial - where the great reformer was admitted to the Order in 1505 and lived there until 1507; the 650 years old Kraemer Bridge, lined on both sides with little shops a structure unique in its kind in Europe. Independent lunch.

This afternoon we continue to Eisenach. Here, we will see the Bach House with its collection of Bibles and religious books of that time. Check-in at hotel in Eisenach. Evening Prayer in common.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Eisenach. (B,D)

Day 5 October 15, Friday: Wartburg Castle - Flossenbürg - Munich

After breakfast, we visit Wartburg Castle, which was most important during the Reformation. While Luther was staying here (1521 to 1522), he translated the New Testament into the language of the people. Then, we continue to visit Flossenbürg concentration camp. After Dachau, Buchenwald and Sachsenhausen, Flossenbürg was the fourth concentration camp established in Germany by the Nazis. It was in a small village located in a beautiful area, with many forests and mountains, not far from Weiden. This location was chosen by Himmler in May of 1938. Flossenbürg is where Dietrich Bonhoeffer died. Independent lunch.

Continue to Munich to check-in at hotel. Evening prayer in common.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Munich (B,D)

Day 6 October 16, Saturday: Munich - Rome (by train)

Breakfast at your hotel. Then, you will be transferred to Munich First-class Train.* (*Package price based upon first-class train tickets. However, first-class seats cannot be guaranteed until confirmed by the train company.)

Depart Munich Train Station at 9:33 am. Train to Rome.

Arrive at Rome Termini Station at 8:10 pm (10 hours and 37 minutes), where you will be met by a Passages by Peter's Way representative and transferred to your hotel in Rome. Evening Prayer in common.

Overnight at hotel in Rome. (B)

Day 7 October 17, Sunday: Worship - PM/Tour of the Catacombs and Ancient Rome

Breakfast at your hotel. Sunday Worship in Rome (location to be advised). Independent lunch. This afternoon, begin an unusual tour of Rome and her outskirts as you motor past the Tiberina Island, the Aventine Hill, the pyramid of Caius Cestius, and St. Paul's Gate, part of the Aurelian Wall, the ancient city wall. Drive along a section of the Old Appian Way, one of the first ancient Roman military roads, which connected Rome to Naples and Brindisi on the Adriatic coast. You can see the huge slabs that originally paved its length and several surviving patrician tombs that once lined its way, including the massive tomb of Cecilia Metella. Our next stop is the Catacombs, the underground maze of tunnels hollowed out of volcanic rock where early Christians - persecuted by the Romans - secretly practiced their religious rites and buried their dead. Prayer and reflection at the Catacombs. Continuing on, we will visit the Church of St. Peter in Chains to see the original chains in which St. Peter was brought captive to Rome and the statue of Moses, one of Michelangelo's greatest masterpieces. Then, we continue to the ancient Roman Forum. Then, see the Arch of Titus and the Arch of Constantine and proceed to the outside of the Coliseum for a fascinating explanation of its history. Continue on to the grandiose white marble monument of King Victor Emmanuel II, often called the "Wedding Cake." See the Trajan Column and the Market (the ancient Roman equivalent

of a department store).

Visit the Trevi Fountain to toss in a coin to insure your "Arrivederci, Roma." Evening Prayer in common.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome.

Day 8 October 18, Monday: AM/Tour of Christian Rome - PM/Visit the Vatican Ecumenism Office & The Augustinian Monastery

Breakfast at your hotel. After breakfast, begin your day with a visit to the magnificent Basilica of St. Paul. It was built by Constantine in the 4th century on the site of St. Paul's tomb. After having been totally destroyed by fire in 1823, it was rebuilt on the original basilican plan of early Christian churches. Surrounding the nave are the medallions of each Pope, from Peter to Benedict XVI. Continue your tour to the Cathedral of St. John Lateran, the first Christian church to be consecrated. It was founded by the Emperor Constantine in the 4th century and was home to the Popes for many years prior to the present Vatican residence. End your morning tour with a visit to the Basilica of St. Mary Major, one of the four major Basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III (AD 432-440). View the impressive interior with its remarkable mosaics in the nave depicting scenes from the Old Testament. The mosaics above the entablature are among the most ancient Christian mosaics in Rome. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, meet and visit the Vatican Office of Christian Unity and the Augustinian Monastery at Piazza del Popolo. Evening Prayer in common. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome.

Day 9 October 19, Tuesday: Full-day excursion to Assisi - Visit the Sites of St. Francis

After breakfast, board your comfortable motor coach for an excursion to Assisi, one of the high points of any travel experience. After a two-hour ride you will see Assisi on a mountaintop. The narrow lanes, the Shrines of Saint Francis and the overwhelming art dedicated to its young friar - a rich young man who turned to God after an illness and established an order that has grown stronger over the centuries. Visit the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli, a great basilica built in 1569 crowned by the magnificent dome designed by Alessi. It enclosed the shrine of the "Porziuncula" or the Little Portion Chapel around which the first Franciscan community was centered, the place where Clare received the habit from Francis, and the Capella Del Transito that marks the spot where the Saint died. You will see the statue of Saint Francis in the courtyard where thornless roses bloom. Continuing, we visit the Basilica of St. Clare, the first and most important heroine of the Franciscan movement, view her remains and see the miraculous Crucifix. Independent lunch and some shopping.

This afternoon, walk to the Basilica of St. Francis for prayer and reflection at the Tomb of St. Francis. Then, our local guide will take us to explore the Basilica complex, which is actually composed of two churches built one atop the other. Beneath both churches is the crypt that houses the tomb of St. Francis. The lower Basilica dates from 1228 to 1230, and is richly decorated with beautiful stained glass windows and paintings done by some of the most important artists of the 13th and 14th centuries. In the upper Basilica, built from 1230 - 1253, you will marvel at the monumental frescoes painted by Giotto, which depict scenes from the life of the saint.

Dinner in Assisi. Then, return for overnight at hotel in Rome.

Day 10 October 20, Wednesday: AM/Papal Audience - PM/Tour of the Vatican Museum; Sistine Chapel; St. Peter's Basilica - Evening/Farewell to Rome Dinner at Roman Restaurant

Breakfast at your hotel. You will then be transported into the heart of Christendom for an audience with Pope Benedict XVI. Our Pilgrimage will be acknowledged when announced during the English language portion. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, begin your day of sightseeing with a visit to the Vatican Museums. Walk through the richly decorated galleries. Continue on to the Sistine Chapel, the private chapel of the Popes, where Michelangelo best expressed his genius in monumental frescoes. End your morning tour in St. Peter's Basilica to see Michelangelo's magnificent "Pieta" and to take in the awesome architecture and the statuary adorning this largest of all Christian churches. Time permitting, on your own, visit the famous Pinacoteca (Picture Gallery), which houses religious works by Giotto, Raphael, da Vinci, Caravaggio and Rodin, among others.

Tonight, enjoy a 'Farewell to Rome' dinner at Azienda Agricola Il Castellaccio, a charming hilltop farmhouse that offers a warm welcome in the incomparably beautiful scenery of the Agro Roman Country. Experience an atmosphere of hospitality and friendship, and taste the Mediterranean cuisine in a typical Roman atmosphere with wine and music. Evening Prayer in Common. Overnight at hotel in Rome.

Day 11 October 21, Thursday: Return to USA

Breakfast at your hotel. Then you will be transferred to Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport for your return flight to the U.S.A. Arrive on the same day.

- Round-trip jet economy class transportation via Continental Airlines: Cleveland/Newark/Berlin - Rome/Newark/Cleveland.
- One-way first-class train ticket between Munich and Rome.
- U.S. departure, Customs user fee; security and all airport departure taxes.
- Meeting and assistance upon departure from Cleveland-Hopkins International Airport.
- European breakfast daily and eight (8) dinners, including a farewell dinner with wine and entertainment at Azienda Agricola Il Castellaccio in Rome.
- Nine (9) nights' accommodations in twin-rooms with private facilities in hotels throughout.
- Portage of one piece of luggage per person at hotels in Europe.
- All sightseeing as per the attached itinerary in a private, deluxe, air-conditioned motor coach with the services of a Passages by Peter's Way government-licensed, English-speaking tour manager upon arrival in Berlin to depart in Rome (excluding train ride from Munich to Rome).

PAYMENT: Deposits and insurance payments will be accepted in the form of check or money order only. In an effort to keep prices as low as possible, the package price reflects a cash discount. However, it is possible to make your final payment via MasterCard, Visa, Discover, or American Express. A \$100.00 convenience fee will apply to all packages paid by credit card. Invoices and credit card authorization forms will be included with your welcome document. The credit card form must be completed in entirety in order for the transaction to be approved. Passages by Peter's Way reserves the right to increase package rate or reduce services accordingly should there be an escalation in the exchange rate over the US dollar in excess of 10% from print date. If for any reason payment is received within 21 days of departure, a charge for express mailing of final documents will be required.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip from Cleveland CLE via Continental Airlines. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. Airfare is subject to increases prior to date of travel. By sending your deposit together with your completed reservation form before the deposit deadline, airfare will be guaranteed against future fare increases excluding tax increases or fuel surcharges. Tax and fuel surcharge estimation is based on increases imposed by airlines and is subject to increase prior to ticketing (approximately 30 days prior to departure). (see LATE RESERVATIONS) Airlines will provide a block of seats for the group. Individual requests for seating preferences can be made at time of check-in only. If you are a member of the frequent flyer or affiliate program, please bring your account card to the airport on the day of departure to receive proper mileage credit. ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: Price per person is based on two persons sharing twin bedded rooms with private facilities in hotels throughout your tour. Triple Rooms are available for family or friends traveling together. We discourage triple room accommodations because they are normally not spacious and there is no discount for triple occupancy. Triple rooms usually are regular twin or double-bedded rooms with a cot or rollaway bed added. Single Rooms are limited but may be requested at time of booking for an additional charge of \$695.00. While single rooms provide privacy, they are often smaller than twin rooms and are sometimes located away from the group in a different area of the hotel, and may be in high traffic areas, such as stairways/elevators. We honestly do not like to assess an additional charge for the single traveler and will make every effort (if you so desire) to match you with a same gender roommate when we receive your application, but we do not guarantee a roommate can be matched. If a single room must be assigned due to your roommate's cancelling, incompatibility or for any other reason (even at the last moment or while on tour), we must charge you the tour's single supplement or pro-rated amount.

MEALS: European breakfast daily and eight (8) dinners, including a farewell dinner with wine and entertainment at Azienda Agricola Il Castellaccio in Rome. Beverages (coffee, tea, mineral water) are not included at set menu dinners.

SIGHTSEEING AND ENTRANCE FEES: All sightseeing as per itinerary aboard a private motorcoach with the services of a professional, licensed, English-speaking guide. Entrance fees to all sights are included.

Please be advised, passenger(s) opting for the land only package or who are deviating from the group itinerary will be responsible for their own transfers to/from Hotel/Airport.

BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE: Due to bus space, one carry-on bag and one checked bag per person is permitted. Standard airline baggage policies usually allow checked baggage up to 62 total inches and range to 50 pounds and carry-on baggage up to 45 total inches and 15 to 40 pounds. TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: All participants must have a valid passport. US Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months, subsequent to the return date. Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current requirements. It is solely the passenger's responsibility to ensure that all documents needed are completed and current. Passages by Peter's Way will not be held responsible for lack of current and valid entry documents.

SERVICE CHARGES: All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave Euro 1.00 per person for the waiters after each meal provided; Euro 1.00 per person per day for the Maid/Bell Boys.

TIPPING: For good work, recommended (but voluntary) tipping to your driver is Euro 2.00 per passenger per day; to the tour manager/guide Euro 3.00 per passenger per day; to the local guides Euro 1.00 per passenger per tour session. Tips for the bus driver and tour manager/guide are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. Other gratuities are usually handled individually.

TRAVELER HEALTH ADVISORY: All passengers must ensure that they are medically and physically fit for travel and that such traveling will not endanger themselves or others as Pilgrimages entail a lot of walking, climbing up/down stairs, etc. Any passenger who is physically challenged must submit a certificate from his/her medical doctor stating that he/she is capable of taking part in this pilgrimage without assistance. If special assistance is required, the passenger must travel with a companion willing and capable of providing any necessary assistance.
